Delta Lambda Boulé of Nassau, Bahamas, held its sixteenth annual Gentlemen's Club Ball on May 5 at the Nassau Marriott and Crystal Palace Hotel. The theme of the event, which was produced by Archousa Marcheta Eneas, was "Back to the Bahamas." Her annual productions are the envy of the island, and this year was no different. The ballroom was transformed into a tropical paradise reminiscent of the small villages in the family islands.

Since 1992, the Gentlemen's Club has provided a mentoring and scholarship program to encourage senior boys in high school who excel in school to hone their talents and skills in preparation for higher education and, ultimately, leadership roles in society. The program consists of twelve weeks of intensive training in areas such as college counseling, career choices, moral responsibility, fiscal management, emotional maturity, etiquette and ballroom dancing.

This year the program graduated forty-two young men from seventeen different schools, with an average grade point average of 3.34. There are more than \$125,000 in scholarship funds available to the young men through the program. The Gentleman of the Year received \$15,000, the first runner-up \$12,000 and the second runner-up \$8,000. As in previous years, a \$12,000 scholarship in the name of deceased Archon William Thompson was presented by Archousa

punctuality, success in toastmasters competitions and marketing ability. In addition to the awards given by Delta Lambda, Omega Psi Phi presented a \$1,500 scholarship, and Fisk University and Morehouse College both awarded two four-year full-tuition scholarships.

The gentlemen, each of whom had chosen a young lady to be his escort, danced the waltz with their mothers and performed the merengue with their escorts. The young men wore white tie, and the ladies were radiant in pastel gowns. Delta Lambda, in conjunction with the Bahamas Beautillion Committee, organized workshops for the young ladies. This effort was led by Archousa Joyanne Ferguson, who counseled them in make-up, poise, dress, etiquette and education. The entire evening, as the more than four hundred attendees agreed, was a smashing success.

Hosted by Florida A&M University president Archon James Ammons, the Inaugural President's Cup Golf Tournament was a rousing success as more than 125 golfers participated, including ten Archons from Alpha Zeta Boulé of Tallahassee. The tournament was held at Tallahassee's South Wood Golf Club on August 13 and featured a shotgun start with a modified scramble format.
