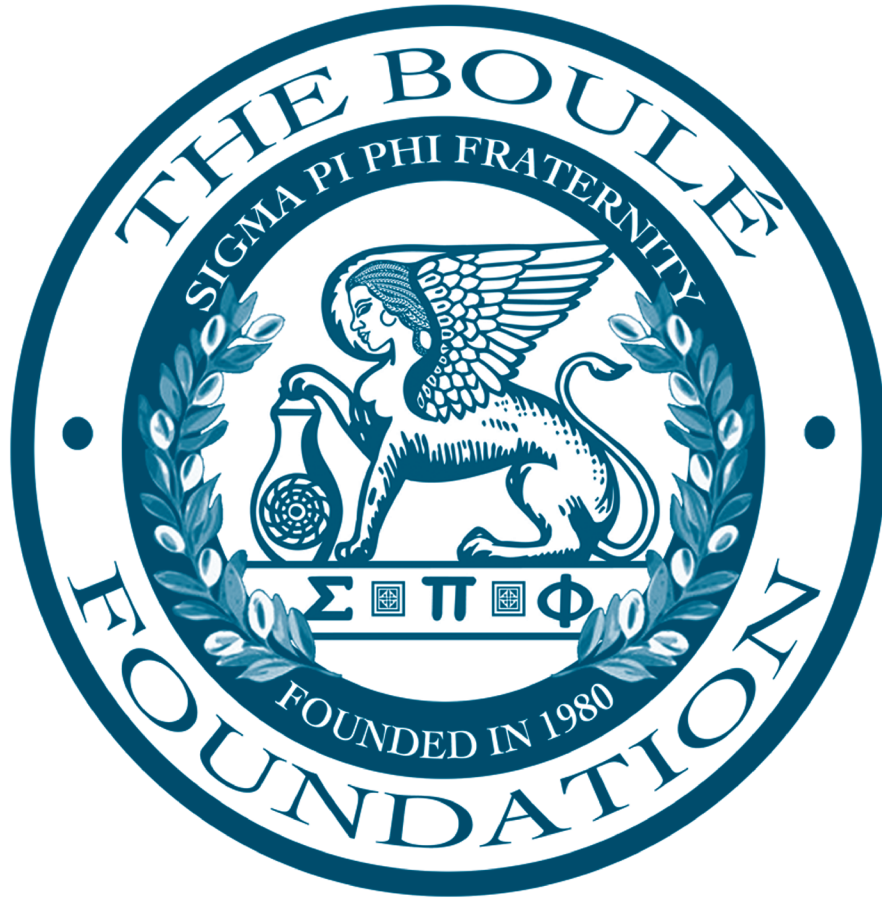

BOULÉ FOUNDATION NAMES 2008 NATIONAL SCHOLAR

Frances B. Roberts-Gregory, a recent graduate of Washington-Lee High School in Arlington, Virginia, received the 2008 Boulé Foundation National Achievement Scholars' Award. It was presented to her on June 16 by Beta Nu Boulé Sire Archon Curtis F. Reaves of Houston, Texas. She is the daughter of Mrs. Robin Roberts and Mr. Brian Gregory.

Roberts-Gregory earned an international baccalaureate diploma following a rigorous two-year college-preparatory program in which she ranked first in her graduating class of 360 with a 4.0 grade point average. In addition to excelling academically, for two years she was president of the African Awareness Society and treasurer of the National Honor Society, and for a year she was captain of the junior varsity cheerleading team. She was a junior mentor in the Coalition of 100 Black Women's mentoring program and worked for two summers as a youth employee at St. Claire's Social Services in Newark, New Jersey. As an intern at Howard University in the summer of 2006, she was assigned to the U.S. Department of Energy in Washington, D.C.

Among her numerous other honors is the Bill Gates Foundation Millennium Scholarship.
